We are greatly indebted to Matt Archer (CMS-A misso, pictured) as he kindly drove us to Arusha. Our two day journey could not have been more interesting, as we passed through the Serengeti. The kids loved seeing zebra, wildebeest, giraffe, lions, elephants, hippos, buffalos, crocs, impala, hyenas, ostriches and many other African animals. The highlight was seeing a lion in the grass beside the road, about a metre from the car, which (if we had no sense whatsoever) we could have reached out and touched.

## Moving in!

We have been at Mungu Ishi Bible College now 2 days, so it is still early, but our first impressions are very positive. It is a beautiful place, green and lush. The campus and farm are very well kept. The students and teachers have been very welcoming. Our house is still a few weeks off completion, but coming along well. The weather has been divine - we've used doonas and jumpers for the first time in Tanzania. Mt Meru stands overlooking us all. Arusha is about a half hours drive, where we can go for supplies. We are still awaiting our car, but it's getting closer!

Students are on their second last week of classes. They then take exams, with graduation on 5th June. There are 9 students completing courses this year. Mike will begin teaching with the new intake in July. In the meantime we are building on our language skills, setting up our house and getting to know students and staff.
